


# Programs

Examples of positions include teachers, dishwashers, warehouse workers, administrative assistants, receptionists, nurses, bakers, bus drivers, paralegals and many more!

ticipants the opportunity to do just that. Harbor House gives participants the opportunity to earn a paycheck and work for a living. Participants' jobs include sorting, folding, labeling, tabbing, stuffing envelopes, and other mail related tasks.

The staff in the bulk mail department works closely with the United States Postal Service to ensure that Harbor House is up to date with the strict regulations and requirements given for bulk mailings. Harbor House staff also works hard to provide customers with the best pricing and turnaround available. Harbor House delivers around 60,000 pieces of mail a month to the USPS.

To the Board of Directors Harbor House of Louisville, Inc. Louisville, Kentucky


